



NEW! **Counselor-In-Training Program**

What is a CIT?

A CIT (Counselor-In-Training) is a young teenager who is partnered with Senior Counselors to lead groups of children aged 3 to 12. On a daily basis, CITs shadow counselors and interact closely with campers. Being a CIT is a unique experience which allows teens to learn and grow as leaders while having fun.

Who can be a CIT?

Any teenager 13 to 15 years old.

What do CITs do?

CITs are partnered with counselors to assist in leading group activities. They interact directly with the younger children on a daily basis. They also help to provide general supervision of campers while learning about safety procedures.



What is expected?

- CITs are expected to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the beginning of camp.
- Dress in appropriate attire, including the Camp Karole program shirt.
- Act in a manner appropriate of a role model for young children.
- Treat fellow CITs and counselors in a professional and appropriate manner.
- CITs must sign up for a minimum of 4 weeks

How much does it cost?

\$250 for each 4 week session.
